

Chapter 6.04 ANIMAL CONTROL CODE

Section 6.04.100 Animal feces.

The owner or person in charge of any dog or other animal shall not permit solid fecal matter of such animal to deposit on any street, alley or other public or private property, unless such matter is immediately removed therefrom by such owner or person in charge. This section shall not apply to a person who is visually or physically handicapped. (Prior code § 7-1-10)

Chapter 6.04 ANIMAL CONTROL CODE

Section 6.04.220 Penalties.

A. Any person violating Sections 6.04.150 through 6.04.210 of this chapter shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00). This section shall also permit the city attorney to apply to the court of competent jurisdiction for a temporary or permanent injunction restraining any person from violating any aspect of the ordinance codified in this chapter.

B. 1. Anyone who violates Sections 6.04.010 through 6.04.050 of this code of ordinances or Chapter 174, Wisconsin Statutes, shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the first offense and not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and not more than four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for any subsequent offenses.

2. Refusal to comply with order or quarantine. An owner who refuses to comply with an order issued under Section 6.04.050 to deliver an animal to an officer, isolation facility or veterinarian or who does not comply with the conditions of an order that an animal be quarantined shall be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned not more than sixty (60) days or both.

C. Any person who violates Sections 6.04.060 through 6.04.140 of this code of ordinances shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the first violation and not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for subsequent violations.
